[IV] (9pts) (1) <u>True or false</u>:

(3) Which number is bigger, $\frac{9}{9} \cdot \frac{8}{9} \cdot \frac{7}{9} \cdot \frac{6}{9}$ or $\frac{10}{10} \cdot \frac{9}{10} \cdot \frac{8}{10} \cdot \frac{7}{10}$?

[V] (6pts) (1) $\frac{1}{2} + \frac{1}{4} + \frac{1}{8} + \frac{1}{16} + \frac{1}{32} + \frac{1}{64} = 1 - \frac{1}{2}$.

(2) Let n be a poistive integer. Then

 $\frac{1}{2^1} + \frac{1}{2^2} + \frac{1}{2^3} + \frac{1}{2^4} + \dots + \frac{1}{2^n} = 1 - \frac{1}{2^n}.$
